The New Year is now solidly upon us. We had a great time at our evening sessions for the religious school over Sukkot and Simchat Torah, learning, celebrating and eating together. It was also great to welcome congregants into our home, and be welcomed into others' homes, during Sukkahs in the City!

Coming off of Sukkot and looking ahead to Thanksgiving, we are in a period of focusing on giving thanks. There are some who believe that the American holiday of Thanksgiving has its roots in Sukkot, which may explain many of the similarities between them: celebrating the harvest, inviting in guests, etc. There are many opportunities on the Jewish calendar to give thanks, and even daily, many of our prayers are focused on the idea of giving thanks for what we have. A teaching in the Mishnah asks the question, "Who is happy?" The response is: "The one who is content with his (her) lot." Our world, especially through media and advertising, tends to have us focus on what we lack. Ads make us keenly aware of the latest technology, cars, and other material goods that we ought to purchase. They make us desire services we may not really need, or remind us of other things we lack. Judaism reminds us to turn our thoughts away from envy and lack and

to be grateful for what we have. Yet gratitude is not a prescription for rose colored glasses. We can use what we have to both be grateful and make the world a better place. A story, probably urban legend, tells of the violinist Itzhak Perlman, who breaks a string on his violin at the beginning of a solo. Rather than stop, replace the string and begin again, he continues with the musical piece, finding the notes on the remaining strings or rearranging the music to work with the strings he had, saying at the end, "It is the artist's task to make beautiful music with what you have left." We are not to wallow in the string that is missing, but rejoice and create beauty with the strings we have. The modern Hebrew phrase for gratitude, *hakarat hatov*, recognizing the good, already suggests that is it this shift of mindset that truly is gratitude. Instead of sitting around bemoaning the things we lack or wish to change, we can use the strings we have to find the good and make the change.

This is a little taste of musar, a Jewish practice for personal growth through a values-based approach. If you'd like to try a few more tastes, **please join us next month on December 4 for our Day of Learning**, where we will be delving into a selection of Jewish middot, values, throughout the day.
