## Rabbi Tina Sobo Jerome Epstein Family Director of Education

One of the tenets of Lurianic Kabbalah, a form of Jewish mysticism, holds the belief that prior to creation, God filled the entirety of existence. There was no room for the world. In order to create the world, God contracted (tzimtzum) to make space, a void, in which to create the world. In 1974, Eugene Borowitz drew on this concept, challenging Rabbis to re-think our leadership in his essay: *Tzimtzum: A Mystic Model for Contemporary Leadership*. Rather than be a leader that takes up all the space, we ought to engage in tzimtzum, allowing room for others to lead as well. He called not for a retraction of leadership that just leaves a void, but an alternation that allows others to fill the space with you. This article, which I first read several years ago, has stuck with me. This month, as I begin my maternity leave, I find myself returning to Borowitz' ideas in this article.

We have an excellent teaching staff, and while I often try to create opportunities for them to rise into leadership within the school, in the next two months they will have greater opportunity to do so. The beginning of the school year and all our preparation over the summer have been leading up to what one might see as this moment (or several weeks) of tzimtzum. I cannot set the religious school up to run itself during my absence – our school is not a robot (and never ought be!), but I can set it up to have the proper people in place to allow excellent learning to continue. Among other things in the weeks ahead our students will experience different prayer leaders who will bring their own personalities and approaches to prayer.

But I realize that I will also be beginning the journey of tzimtzum as a parent again. When a baby is first born, there is complete dependence on parents (or

other adults) to meet its needs. I remember the awe when Stephanie was born, that my body could create a separate, living, breathing, being, and provide for all of her needs (until she discovered solid food!). But, as a parent, you slowly move from those first days of fulfilling every need, to having a toddler (and in the years ahead, child, teen, young adult...) who grows in independence. Parents must be able to tzimtzum themselves in order to make room for first steps and the “me do” stage of toddlerhood, to driving, going to college, entering adult relationships, and beyond. And while I still have a long way to go on that journey with Stephanie, it will be incredible to start the process anew with her younger sister.

And while talking about my upcoming maternity leave – I would like to extend a hearty thank you to those who helped plan the baby shower and everyone who was able to celebrate the imminent arrival of Baby Sobo. It is truly an honor and a blessing to have such support from my Temple family!
