Sadly, that has not been the case and the virus is worse than ever. As much as we look forward to the close of this awful year, it is equally deflating as we realize that change may not come so quickly. This year may be behind us, but it will likely take much of this next year before we can see a path toward normal living. For many, these seem to be especially dark times. But, as we have learned time and time again, no darkness lasts forever. Even a small cruse of oil can outshine all expectations. Times are certainly hard. And for some, even harder. But even in these shadows, we can seek out the light.

I was reminded recently that we have much for which to be grateful. We have far better conditions for weathering a pandemic today than did those who lived in 1918. At times it may be hard to feel their warmth, but the candles are still burning. Even in a pandemic (or especially in a pandemic) we need to keep our hopes alive. We must keep ourselves strong of body, but our spirit must also be strengthened. Like the candles in our Hanukkah menorah, we must keep the fire burning. We must continue to set New Year’s resolutions and work towards them, feel gratitude, bring our light into the world, and strengthen one another as we connect in our virtual spaces.

May there be light and blessing for us all in the new year.
