AMERICANS AND THE HOLOCAUST

This spring, a special exhibit will visit the Dayton Metro Library from May 18 – June 21. According to the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum, "The Americans and the Holocaust traveling exhibition addresses important themes in American history, including Americans' responses to refugees, war and genocide in the 1930s and '40s. This exhibition will challenge the commonly held assumptions that Americans knew little and did nothing about the Nazi persecution and murder of Jews as the Holocaust unfolded. Drawing on a remarkable collection of primary sources from the 1930s and '40s, the exhibition focuses on the stories of individuals and groups of Americans who took action in response to Nazism." It will challenge visitors to think about not only what our own responses may have been if we had been there, but also about what we can do now.

It is during this time, that I am reminded of how the end of one chapter leads to the beginning of a new one. Reflecting on this past “chapter” of our religious school, I am so grateful to our teaching staff. Their dedication and hard work is appreciated, and their ability to adapt and change is remarkable. The last few years have not been kind to any of us, but this year has felt a little more “normal” for the first time in three years. Hopefully, this is one new chapter that is here to stay.

As we celebrate endings and beginnings this month, I hope you will join us at our Teacher Appreciation & Senior Send-off Share Shabbat service and potluck dinner on Friday, May 5. We will honor our teachers and madrichim for a job well done this year, and we will wish our graduating seniors the best of luck in the future. It will be a joy to watch them continue on their journey.

Looking ahead to another beginning: the registration materials for the 2023-24 religious school year are going out now. It helps significantly in our planning to know how many students are committed to attending. All congregants with school-age children should receive registration materials by mail in early May. Pay in full by May 31 and save up to \$50 in registration fees. Madrichim

applications will be due on June 30 and should be sent to me. We are happy to welcome all children in preschool through grade 10 to our program.

Our comprehensive curriculum includes a progressive academic program as well as Jewish dance, music and art, while our experienced faculty makes learning fun for the little ones on up. The integrated curriculum we use was shaped by our congregation to reflect and reinforce our values.

In addition to ongoing use of Hebrew in Judaics classes, students in third through sixth grade also study Hebrew using the Union for Reform Judaism’s Mitkadem program, which is a liturgy-based Hebrew learning program that is self-paced. The goal of our program is to teach the skills and knowledge our students will need in order to feel comfortable praying in a Reform Jewish setting.

If you have any questions about our program, especially if you are new or newer to Temple, please reach out to me, or to Rabbi Bodney-Halasz during my leave.

Next school year will begin on Sunday, August 20 with our teaching team training (for teachers and madrichim) and opening picnic (for all). Be sure to mark your calendars!

May this transition into the summer mark the end of a fruitful year and the start of something new.

SHAVUOT & CONFIRMATION



On Thursday, May 25 at 6:30PM, we will celebrate the festival of Shavuot and Confirmation of Jonathan Shtilman. The service will include a Yizkor memorial section to remember loved ones who passed this year and allow us to find comfort as a community.

The festival of Shavuot (Hebrew for "weeks")

celebrates the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai, and encourages us to embrace the teachings of our Torah and be inspired by the wisdom and knowledge that our Jewish tradition has to offer. It occurs seven weeks after Passover.

Shavuot began as an ancient agricultural festival that marked the end of the spring barley harvest and the beginning of the summer wheat harvest. In ancient times, Shavuot was a pilgrimage festival during which Israelites brought crop offerings to the Temple in Jerusalem. Today, it is a celebration of Torah, education, and the choice to participate actively in Jewish life. Please join us on May 25.

WOMEN OF VALOR HONOREES

On Wednesday, May 10 at 11:30AM, our bimah team, along with three other Dayton area female spiritual leaders, will be honored as Women of Valor at Beth Abraham Synagogue. We are so grateful to have such strong leadership in our congregation. This honor is particularly special this year, as we mark fifty

years of women in the rabbinate, starting with the ordination of Sally Priesand at Hebrew Union College - Jewish Institute of Religion in 1972. In the last five decades, the role of women across all movements of Judaism has changed and evolved. However, it wasn't an overnight change. Many organizations in our movement, as well as others, helped women to succeed in this spiritual calling, giving them the resources and tools to get ahead.

Both Rabbi Bodney-Halasz and Rabbi Sobo are members of the Women's Rabbinic Network, a constituent of the Central Conference of American Rabbis (CCAR). It was created in 1975 by a group of female rabbinic students to provide the support and advocacy

needed in the early years of women in the Reform rabbinate. Since then, the organization has grown to include over 700 women reform rabbis who have been ordained since 1972 at the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion.

Music director and cantorial soloist, Courtney Cummings serves on the board of directors for the Guild of Temple Musicians. While not solely dedicated to supporting female musicians, this group was founded to broaden the tent of Jewish music and support music directors, composers, soloists, instrumentalists, choir directors, and volunteer musicians who create the sound of Jewish music in the synagogue setting.

We can't think of a better way

to pay homage to this evolution in spiritual leadership than to honor the women who lead our Dayton congregations. We hope you will feel moved to not only support Temple Israel's spiritual endeavors with a donation to the rabbis' discretionary funds or to Temple's music fund, but also contribute to another group or organization, like the Women's Rabbinic Network or the Guild of Temple Musicians, that lifts up women's voices in the Jewish world.
