RABBI'S MESSAGE

MODEH ANI – I GIVE THANKS

As we transition from the sacred, reflective days of Tishrei to the quieter month of Cheshvan, it's tempting to let the feelings of awe and introspection fade into the background. Yet, our tradition teaches us that the practice of gratitude isn't confined to festive days - it's something

we're called to weave into our everyday lives.

In the musar tradition, the concept of hakarat hatov, recognizing the good, reminds us to actively affirm the blessings in our lives, no matter how small. Cultivating awareness of all we have to be thankful for shapes how we see the world. The first words we're taught to say each morning when we rise are "Modeh Ani" or "Modah Ani" - "I give thanks." This practice sets the tone for the day ahead. The Talmud even teaches us to strive to give thanks at least 100 times each day, encouraging us to seek gratitude in even the smallest of moments.

In a world that can often feel heavy with challenges, it's crucial to shift our perspective towards hope and possibility. Taking a moment each morning to offer thanks can reframe our outlook for the rest of the day. It's my hope that we can learn to incorporate this value into our lives as we begin the new year.

On that note, I want to extend my heartfelt thanks to everyone who helped make our recent High Holy Days and fall holiday celebrations so meaningful. While we faced some unexpected twists and turns, being together and praying with kavannah - with intention - made every service a true success. Of course, these experiences don't happen on their own. So many individuals worked behind the scenes to make everything possible. I want to especially recognize Suzanne Shaw, Jodi Phares, Ellen Finke-McCarthy, Annette Stogdill, Jessica Ragno, Scott Francis, and Fred

"When I first entered the doors of Temple Israel I was feeling very anxious. I had never been inside of a temple or synagogue as part of any religious service. As someone starting their conversion journey AND as someone who did not particularly find meeting new people a cakewalk, I was feeling a bit like turning around and giving myself props for making it to the parking lot. As soon as I entered the doors I was greeted by people making warm eye contact, asking me my name, and welcoming me to Temple. That first experience has been echoed in the many months that I have gotten more involved at Temple. I have found guidance, community, and people that challenge my way of thinking, encouraging me to grow while still allowing me to feel accepted. In moments where I have not been able to be as present as I would like due to cancer treatments, fellow members continue reaching out, setting up zoom meetings, and dropping off meals."



"Just as important to me has been the welcome that members have shown my husband and family, all of whom are not Jewish. It is so important to me that my husband especially feels comfortable participating in a space that brings so much meaning to my life. The same warm reception that I received has been extended to him. He looks forward to participating in Temple events and has grown to care deeply for our community. I've also felt comfortable bringing other non-Jewish family and friends to Temple events, exposing them to Judaism in a way that could have otherwise been overwhelming. In hard times and in good, Temple Israel has become a place that nourishes both my body and my soul. I am so grateful to call this place my spiritual home."

We thank Mariah for sharing her story. It is through a story like this that we celebrate the strength of our Temple Israel community, where people from all walks of life come together to build connections, deepen their Jewish experience, and create lasting memories.
