# RABBI'S MESSAGE

## TEMPLE TEENS ON A MISSION: L'TAKEN SOCIAL JUSTICE SEMINAR

I recently had the privilege of accompanying five of our teens to Washington, D.C. for the L'Taken Social Justice weekend.

This four-day program hosted by the Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism was, as one of our students shared, "life-

changing." With 500 other teens, they dove into major social justice issues and explored how Jewish values can inform their advocacy efforts. From gun control to environmental justice, they learned how to connect their faith with their passion for change. The highlight of our trip was when they headed to Capitol Hill to lobby for issues they are passionate about. Our students returned home inspired and empowered to make a difference in our community.



Jonah Dritz, Matteo Chaiten, and Hillary Katchman spoke out about the importance of voting rights, highlighting the challenges many Americans face when trying to exercise their

right to vote. They advocated for the Freedom to Vote Act, which aims to make sure every eligible citizen has access to the ballot.

Hannah Dritz and Jonah Halasz delivered a powerful speech about antisemitism, sharing

their own personal experiences and emphasizing the need for collective action to combat this growing threat. They urged lawmakers to support the Countering Antisemitism Act.

Here are some of their thoughts:

**Matteo Chait-**

**en:** *I don't have to worry about struggling with voting due to being male, white, and not even eligible.*

*Yet, I still care because in these last couple days I have learned that even after all the progress we've made, there are still struggles with voting. If I was in a situation like some people are, where voting is difficult, I would want people to try to help me. Over this weekend, I had to role-play voting as a Hispanic American man trying to vote, and I couldn't meet the voting deadline due to several obstacles. This really opened my eyes to how important this issue is.*



**Jonah Dritz:** *I had no idea what a challenge it is for some people to vote. I took an elective about voting rights and past voting laws. We did an activity where we were given an ethnicity, literacy in English, and a year in which we would be voting and then saw how long it would take to get through the voting process. Throughout this activity, I learned just how many problems and obstacles there are for people trying to vote, like limited places to vote, as just one example of many. Before this activity I thought that when people didn't vote it was because they chose not to, but now I see that there are so many reasons why someone might not be able to vote, or vote easily, and that is why I chose to speak to you about this problem.*

**Hannah Dritz:** *Through the aftermath of the devastation of the Holocaust, we repeated the words "Never again." Yet despite this pledge we have made, I find myself standing here in front of you for I can see acts of anti-Jewish hatred rising once again....*



Since the October 7th terrorist attack, there has been a dramatic increase in instances of antisemitism relating to Israel, especially on college campuses. Criticism of Israel's government is not inherently antisemitism. It is

acceptable to criticize the Israeli government's actions and policies. However, this criticism can cross the line into antisemitism when it denies Israel's right to exist as a Jewish state, questions the loyalties of Jews around the world, draws on classic antisemitic tropes, and leads to the harassment of Jews and Jewish organizations because of the real or perceived views on Israel. Since October 7th, we have seen that line crossed far too many times. This major increase we have seen in antisemitism in recent years is unacceptable and poses a danger not only to Jews but also to Americans. It feels like we have forgotten about that "never again."

**Hillary Katchman:** We stand before you today not just as advocates for democracy, but as firm believers that the right to vote is fundamental to making democracy possible. Throughout our American history, voting rights have been fought for through bloodshed and victory, dating back to when George Washington and his troops fought against the British to sustain Democracy. This is why we are here today; we must continue to ensure what America stands for - and that is the right to vote and to have a say in our country. With your help, we can work together to ensure that every voice is heard, every vote

is counted, and every citizen has the power to bring change to our country.

**Jonah Halasz:** It is painful to see how easily people allow hatred and ignorance to cloud their judgment. The way some casually threw around antisemitic jokes or openly disrespected my identity made me question how such prejudice could still exist today. The hatred directed toward Jews feels personal, not just because of my own experiences, but because of the generations before me who had faced the same kind of discrimination. Despite this, I never wavered in my pride. I love being Jewish, and no amount of hate could take that away from me.

My faith, my culture, and my history are things I cherish, and I refuse to let others make me feel ashamed of who I am. The experiences I endured only strengthened my resolve - I will always carry my Jewish identity with pride and never forget where I came from.

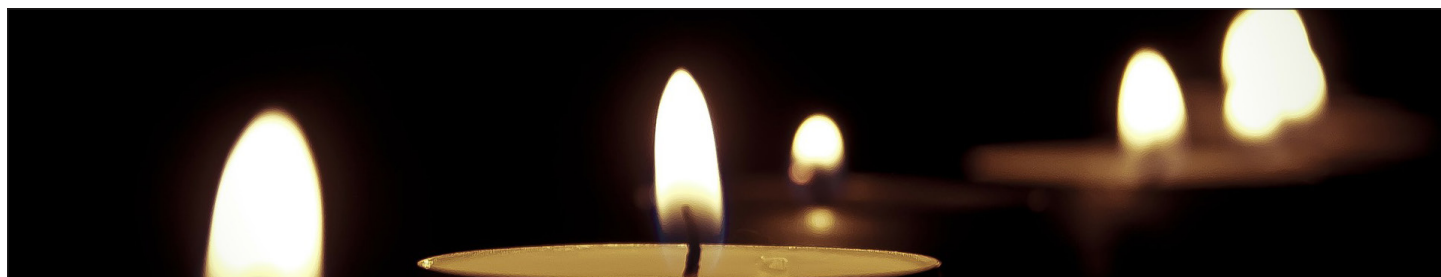
