HOPE IN UNEXPECTED PLACES

REFLECTIONS ON A POWERFUL JOURNEY THROUGH HEARTBREAK, RESILIENCE, AND RENEWAL IN ISRAEL

Sometimes the world surprises you with hope in the places you least expect it. That was the quiet but powerful theme of our recent journey to Israel. In February, a group of us traveled more than 360 miles across the country, with 18 site visits and 44 meetings in just 10 days. It was a demanding schedule - but one filled with meaning, heartbreak, inspiration, and, most of all, connection.

This trip brought us face-to-face with two regions that have long-standing ties to Dayton: the city of Holon, our Sister City just south of Tel Aviv; and Israel's Western Galilee, part of the Partnership2Gether (P2G) network. Through these partnerships, we've built bridges across oceans and time zones—ties that became even more meaningful in the wake of October 7.

We were warmly welcomed by our hosts and guides, who led us through unforgettable experiences across the country. We spent time in the Gaza Envelope, visited the Nova festival site, and experienced communities still deeply

marked by the attacks—Sderot, Nir Oz, and other kibbutzim. The scars of war were visible, and the grief was still fresh. And yet, in nearly every place we visited, we found something unexpected: hope.

In Holon, a city that proudly calls itself “The City of Children,” we saw how a vibrant,



family-friendly atmosphere can coexist with economic vitality and innovation. Meeting with Holon's mayor, Shai Kenan, was a highlight. His passion for education, youth engagement, and



community-building was electric – his words transcended politics and offered a vision of what's possible when leadership is rooted in compassion and courage.

We witnessed innovation that moved us deeply. At the Holon Technological Institute, we met students who, in the early days of the war, recognized a desperate need: protective gear for soldiers and military dogs. In response, they designed and produced new armor – faster, lighter, and more effective. Their ingenuity wasn't just technical—it was profoundly human. Their work may very well have saved lives.

Healthcare was another powerful lens through which we saw hope. At the Galilee Medical Center, we toured facilities designed to provide emergency and routine care in secure underground settings. We saw firsthand how thoughtful infrastructure can become a model of safety and preparedness—not only for Israel, but for communities around the world.

We also shared in deeply emotional and spiritual moments. A Shabbat dinner in a Tel Aviv neighborhood—just steps from where a rocket had fallen—was one such moment. Though we were so close to recent violence, we never once felt unsafe. The warmth, hospitality, and strength of those we met reminded us that safety isn't just about physical distance from danger; it's about trust, connection, and solidarity.

We felt that solidarity again and again. At Hostages Square in Tel Aviv, where we saw the

haunting display of posters, flowers, and messages that keep the memory of the kidnapped alive. And in Akko, where we attended a moving memorial service for the Bibas family. There, as we stood on the steps of city hall, we were thanked simply for showing up. For listening. For caring. It was humbling.

One morning, as the remains of the Bibas children were returned, we stood beside Israelis lining the streets, watching a rainbow stretch across the sea. The pain of the moment was enormous – but so too was the strength in the silence. The unity. The hope.

Throughout the trip, we heard one message, again and again: "Tell our stories. Keep our voices alive. Come back. And bring others with you." That message is one we now carry home with us.

In the coming months, we'll share more about what we saw, what we learned, and what it means for our community. We're especially looking forward to the next Partnership2Gether Summit this October—and we hope to bring an even larger Dayton delegation. The relationships we've built are not just symbolic; they are living connections that shape how we care for one another and how we show up in times of need.



We came home changed. We came home with new ideas, new relationships, and a renewed belief in what we can build together. The journey showed us that hope can grow even in the most unlikely places—and that together, as Am Yisrael, the people of Israel, we are stronger than we ever imagined.

Let us continue to show up – for each other, for our partners in Israel, and for the future we share.

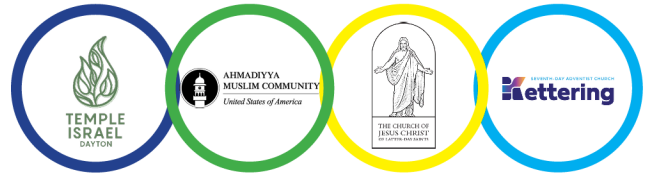
