RABBI'S MESSAGE

CHANUKKAH FOR ALL: A NEW TAKE ON AN OLD FAVORITE

While the Community Wide Religious School Program is one of *my* favorites throughout the school year, it has had a close contender: the Hanukkah Happening. Aside from being the one time I'll spell Chanukkah without the C, it was a morning where predominately our religious school

and families and younger children came together for a celebration of our Festival of Lights before winter break. There were core elements such as presentations by each classroom, latkes, donuts, and the pedal-powered menorah that made yearly appearances, and other favorites that rotated into the mix. There would have been nothing wrong with keeping up the tradition of a fun religious school morning and lunch program. But... sometimes, a little shaking up is in order.

We want **YOU** to come join us. Chanukkah isn't just for children — it's for everyone, and this year's celebration is aimed to foster community across the congregational community, and that means we need not just our religious school, Torah Tots, and Prayer & Play participants — we need **EVERYONE!** Instead of a few fun activities, we are creating **EIGHT** Chanukkah Challenges that will require community, courage, creativity, and maybe a little chutzpah.

Here's a quick preview of the three stations that take some planning on your part ahead of time — the others will be revealed as we get closer:

Chagstacle Course (Pre-registration needed): Your intergenerational team of four will be tasked with completing a Chanukkah themed "chagstacle course." The elements of the course will require a very modest amount of athleticism — but really more sportsmanship and humility than running!

Festival of Imagination (Pre-registration need): Channeling a mash-up of Destination

Imagination Instant Challenge and Chopped's cooking challenges, Your intergenerational team of four will be tasked with a challenge to complete using the mystery supplies in your basket. Our judges will decide who has shown enough creativity to make the cut.

Menorah Masterpieces (Pre-registration strongly encouraged): Get ready to celebrate the Chanukkah miracle with your very own menorah. Participants will create and bring a menorah that will hold both candles and the spirit of Chanukkah. Submissions will be put on display for judging based on creativity, collaboration, and more. Submissions need-not be real-candle lighting safe.

Chanukkah Cart & Commons: Whether you've saved your shopping until the last minute, realized you forgot something, or just want to splurge a bit — we've got you covered. Bring some extra cash to peruse our selection of new Chanukkah necessities and accessories. In addition, take a look at the stash of used items looking for a new home at a price you choose. If you have Chanukkah items in used, but decent condition and want to give them a new life beyond a box in your basement, let us know!

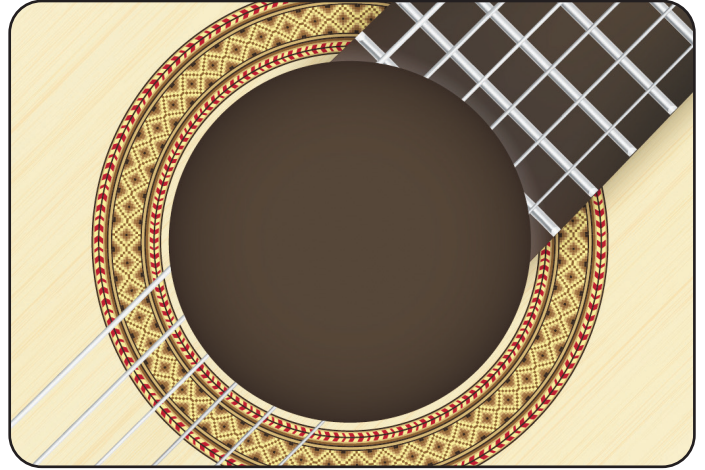

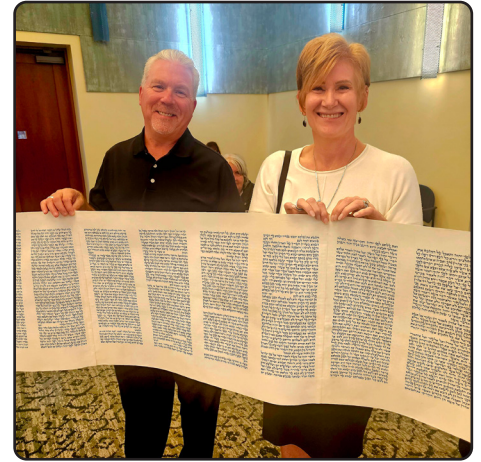

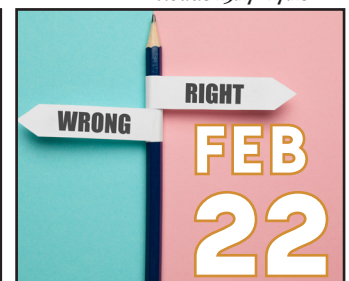
