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RABBI'S MESSAGE

'The past is never dead. It is not even past:' The Contemporary Relevance of the Dreyfus Affair.

In 1894, Captain Alfred Dreyfus of the French Army was accused of spying for Germany. Despite a lack of evidence, his trial ignored normal legal procedures, and he was sentenced to life on Devil's Island. The Dreyfus Affair shook French politics for decades, sparking antisemitic violence in France, inspiring antisemitic parties worldwide, and elevating the early Zionist movement. Fred's presentation will highlight the key events of the affair and explore how its lessons remain relevant today for understanding and responding to antisemitic rhetoric and violence.
