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CALLED TOGETHER

RABBI'S MESSAGE

The sound of the shofar is a call.

We usually think of it as a call to wake up—to pause, pay attention, and think about who we want to be in the year ahead. But throughout Jewish tradition, the shofar has served another purpose as well: it calls people to gather.



I love that this is the sound that announces the New Year. For me, one of the joys of the High Holy Days is seeing our community come together. We reconnect with old friends, welcome new faces, fill the sanctuary with familiar melodies, and begin a new year side by side.

The month of Tishrei brings us together again and again, each time for something a little different. On Rosh Hashanah, we celebrate a new beginning with prayer, music, sweetness, and the sound of the shofar. On Yom Kippur, we return to pray, remember, reflect, seek forgiveness, and consider the changes we hope to make in the year ahead.

Then, just five days later, we gather again.

The Jewish calendar hardly gives us time to pause before moving us from the introspection of Yom Kippur to the joy of Sukkot. This time, we meet beneath the open roof of the sukkah. We eat. We welcome guests. We shake the lulav and etrog. We are even commanded to rejoice. The Jewish calendar makes room for both, moving us quickly from reflection and repentance to gratitude, hospitality, celebration, and joy.

I hope you will join us throughout the High Holy Days as we welcome 5787 together. On September 30, we'll welcome the broader community to Temple Israel for Sukkot Under the Stars with acclaimed

Jewish musician and educator Dan Nichols, whose music has become a part of the soundtrack of contemporary Jewish life. We'll gather around the fire pit, sing together, roast s'mores, enjoy hot drinks, spend time with friends in the sukkah, shake the lulav and etrog, and simply enjoy being together. Bring your family, invite a friend, and come ready to celebrate z'man simchateinu—the season of our joy.

A few days later, on October 4, we will gather again for our Festival Appreciation event. I look forward to this opportunity to thank all of you who give so much of yourselves to make our Jewish Cultural Festival possible. I know how much time, energy, and hard work you give to the Festival each year, and I am enormously grateful. Your efforts bring people from throughout the Jewish and broader Dayton communities together to experience and celebrate Jewish life, while also raising important funds that support Temple Israel throughout the year. We could not do it without you.

I love the rhythm of this month. Tishrei reminds us that community has room for all of it: reflection and celebration, memory and hope, prayer and laughter.

Soon, the shofar will sound, calling us once again to begin. I hope you'll answer that call and begin 5787 with us.

May the year ahead bring sweetness and joy, good health and peace to you and those you love.

Shanah tovah u'metukah!
