WILL BICYCLES RUIN THE PLANET?

A piece I read recently began with an economist's claim that bicycles would lead to the slow death of the planet. The argument was essentially that one who commutes and travels predominately by bicycle would spend less money to purchase the bicycle, wouldn't need a car loan, wouldn't be continually paying for gas, oil, and maintenance on the bike. They wouldn't be getting obese and thus seeking medical care and paying for medications. There wouldn't be costly accidents or as much need for construction crews for multi-lane highways, and more. From the economist's point of view, bicycles will be a disaster for the economy and somehow kill the planet!

From the perspective of a non-economist, this seems absurd. While there may be a point, if the only measuring stick you are using is economic stimulation, then you are leaving out other aspects to consider when calculating the fate of our planet.

So, what do bicycles and their potential impact on the planet have to do with the start of another academic year? Not much, but the way we perceive things does. It is easy to judge students by test scores, their ability to keep a tushy quietly in their seat, or some other skill that is useful in the traditional classroom setting. Or for adults — how many hours you log, emails sitting unread, or otherwise. If all animals were judged on their

ability to climb a tree, we would think poorly of some amazing creatures.

We will enter a new academic year in just a few weeks, and the new Jewish year shortly after that. With each transition in our calendar, we create and dream up expectations for what the year may bring or should bring. It is important to set goals and have a vision of where you hope to go, but in the process, we must also make sure we are using the appropriate measuring stick to judge ourselves and others.

However you choose to travel (bicycle or otherwise), may your journey into this year feel joyous and purposeful, without too much harsh judgement along the way.

We are continuing our Talmud focus this month on studying four ancient rabbis.

Get to know four of the most important of our early rabbis (called "Tannaim") and how they, according to our legends, rebuilt Judaism after the destruction of the Second Temple in 70 CE. Rabbi Yohanan ben

Zakkai, who escaped Jerusalem and made a deal with Vespasian to continue Jewish learning; Rabbi Eliezer ben Hyrkanus, whose prolific memory and stubborn personality led to his eventual excommunication; Rabbi Akiva, an innovator of unique and stunning insights, martyred by the Romans; and Rabbi Elazar ben Arakh, the lone genius.
